## TRENTON: Ghost hunters to spend night in haunted building

TRENTON — Ghost hunters will be spending the night in what many consider to be the most haunted building in southeastern Michigan.

A group of people who practice ghost hunting, employees from local radio station 89x (88.7 fm) and a few others will be spending the night in the basement of TV's Grand Event, 2651 West Jefferson Ave.

The radio station asked listeners what the most haunted place was in the area and TV's Grand Event ended up with the most paranormal stories.

The building, which used to be a hotel and has been downtown for more than a century, hosts wedding receptions and other special events. They also offer full service catering.

The owners, Tracey and Victor Stroia, who also own TV's Deli and Diner on Fort Street, said that they didn't know about the ghost stories when they purchased the building.

Several listeners called the radio station to tell their stories on the air. One host had a story of being in the basement and a camera going off on its own. Victor Stroia said that has happened to many people.

He also said that the doors, which has to be manually locked by a key that only he has, end up locked on a regular basis.

He said the two main ghosts people have claimed to see are a little boy, who drowned in the Detroit River, and a bartender who hanged himself on the second floor of the building.

The people who are spending the night at TV's Grand Event will share their stories and experiences on the radio station Monday morning.
